Lesson Plan 5: Main Personalities

Learning Intentions

At the end of this lesson students will

- 1. Be able to name some of the key personalities involved on the first day,
- 2. Understand their roles and functions,
- 3. Explain why some of those elected were not present on the day.

Key Skills

Communicating, Working With Others, Managing Information and Thinking.

Ask each group to write down 4 facts about their individual on a sheet of paper. They could include facts about the person's early life, activity pre Dáil, what they did on the day and something they did/happened to them afterwards.

Ask the groups to swap sheets and add 4 more facts to each sheet. Continue until each group has added to each sheet.

Each group then reports back on one individual.

Conclusion

As a concluding activity get each student to write a short profile on any two of the key personalities described on the worksheet.
